As a believer in Jesus I wear two hats. One is my faith that Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life. There is no other way to have a relationship with God our Creator. My other hat is that I am a human being, sharing the planet with all kinds of people that I must love and work with as much as possible in connection with all these global problems, including the global climate change crisis.
